### HOW TO SELECT A SENIOR PORTRAIT:

- Review your email for a personalized link to your proofs sent by Rod Bolten Photography
- If you have not received your personalized link go to: https://vando.imagequix.com/g1000935267#login
- Use your Student ID to access your proofs (\*\*\*It usually takes two weeks for them to edit and upload them for review.)
- 1. Enter your gallery & click the red "Yearbook Selection" button in the bottom left corner.
- 2. Choose your favorite pose that fits with our specs below!!
- 3. Click the green "Save" button

We are looking to have the option to put the senior portraits in color this year, therefore we are making clothing requests: Wear black tops OR wear black jackets\* and light colored shirts (white or light blue)

### Information for you & your child:

The yearbook staffs kindly requested attire for the "yearbook pose" ONLY, is black shirts, and black/navy suits with a white/light colored shirt for consistency.

Additional portraits in various poses, and attire, may be purchased at the session for a nominal fee. You will also have the opportunity to purchase portrait packages, but are under NO obligation to do so.

You then must go online and select your "yearbook pose" that is vertical with the bluish background, as seen in the bottom two images to the left.

\*\*\*If you do not select a pose by the date that the yearbooks sets than one of our staff members will review the portraits and select one for you.

# SENIOR PORTRAIT CHECKLIST:

PLEASE WEAR ONLY BLACK!!!! – WE WOULD LIKE THE OPTION TO PRINT THE PHOTOS IN COLOR!!!! (This is for the photo that will be put in the yearbook, family portraits/personal headshots can be taken in any attire you desire)

Tips for success from your Yearbook Staff

### **BEFORE THE BIG DAY:**

- Wear a dark jacket and tie white shirts look best under a jacket (A dark navy blue jacket is fine, as is a light blue shirt)
- Wear a black long sleeve blouse/top and neutral jewelry (keep it simple, you want the attention to be on you, not your accessories)
- Don't try new hairstyles right before!
- · Be sure to shave the day before your portrait
- Wear a little bit more makeup than usual make sure no makeup is clumpy/bring along extra blush, lip gloss, etc. for touchups
- Wearing neutral undergarments will allow them to blend in with the skin more if they are accidentally showing in your picture (these are much easier to touch up)
- Don't get any facial treatments the day before! Allow at least 48 hours for any swelling from facials, waxing, etc. to go down

### FOR THE BIG DAY:

- Glasses can create a glare you can try to take your picture without lenses or without glasses at all.
- Ironing clothes is a must! Wrinkles will show!
- Don't stay up late the night before bags under your eyes will definitely make a difference in your portrait
- Bring a hairbrush with you for last minute touch ups!

### LAST MINUTE CHECK:

- Is your tie straight?
- · Check your neckline to make sure it is appropriate and no undergarments are showing
- · Look at your hair are their any flyaways? Are your bangs in place?
- Makeup check shiny skin, mascara clumps or running, etc.
- · Sit up tall! Straighten your shoulders and smile!
